WHAT IS ONE KEY QUESTION[®]?

One Key Question[®] is a transformative tool that starts the conversation about if, when, and under what circumstances people want to get pregnant and have a child. The notion behind One Key Question[®] is simple—it provides a framework for health care providers, social service providers, and champions to routinely ask:

➤ **“Would You Like to Become Pregnant in the Next Year?”**

One Key Question[®] meets people where they are, by offering four responses:

➤ **Yes, No, Ok Either Way, Unsure**

One Key Question[®] is patient-centered and focuses on understanding people’s goals and providing follow-up care based on the patient’s response, whether that is for birth control, preconception health, prenatal care, or referral to other services. One Key Question[®] proactively addresses the root causes of mistimed pregnancies, poor birth outcomes, and disparities in maternal and infant health. It is non-judgmental and equally supports those who want to become pregnant, those who do not, and those who are ambivalent.

One Key Question[®] is used by thousands of healthcare and social service providers and agencies in approximately 30 states. One Key Question[®] providers include a variety of primary care, family planning, and a wide range of specialty clinicians, community health workers, home visitors, substance use treatment and prevention programs, and many more. One Key Question[®] has been adopted by large health systems, state and local public health departments, and others to address a myriad of health equity efforts, including perinatal equity and maternal child health.


