Fall 2018 Public Policy Internship Opportunity

Power to Decide (formerly The National Campaign to Prevent Teen and Unplanned Pregnancy) is a private, non-partisan, non-profit organization that works to ensure all people—no matter who they are, where they live, or what their economic status might be—have the power to decide if, when, and under what circumstances to get pregnant. Power to Decide works towards three ultimate outcomes:

- Reduce the rate of teen pregnancy by 50% by 2026.
- Reduce the rate of unplanned pregnancy among women age 18-29 by 25% by 2026.
- Reduce the disparities in teen pregnancy and unplanned pregnancy rates among racial/ethnic and socioeconomic groups by 50% by 2026.

Internship description: Power to Decide seeks an organized and detail oriented undergraduate or graduate student to serve as a policy intern for the Fall 2018 Semester. The Public Policy Intern will support the policy team's efforts by tracking legislation and votes, preparing materials for Hill meetings, developing advocacy materials, assisting with research, representing Power to Decide at briefings, and general administrative duties. The Public Policy Intern reports to the Senior Manager of Public Policy. This is a great opportunity to learn how a small non-profit organization advocates for its policy priorities.

Qualifications: The Policy Intern must be currently enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate academic program and able to obtain academic credit for this internship. The intern must have strong written and communications skills, knowledge of the public policy process, and the ability to work effectively and independently in a fast-paced environment. Experience with Congress.gov and a demonstrated interest/knowledge of our federal policy issues are a plus.

Compensation: This is an unpaid internship.

Time Commitment: 20 hours per week (two full days preferred) beginning in late August or early September.
