Position

Power to Decide seeks an organized and detail oriented undergraduate or graduate student to serve as a Public Policy Intern for the Spring 2019 Semester. The Public Policy Intern will support the policy team's efforts by tracking legislation and votes, preparing materials for Hill meetings, developing advocacy materials, assisting with research, representing Power to Decide at briefings, and general administrative duties. The Public Policy Intern reports to the Senior Manager of Public Policy. This is a great opportunity to learn how a small non-profit organization advocates for its policy priorities.

The Public Policy Intern must have strong written and communications skills, knowledge of the public policy process, and the ability to work effectively and independently in a fast-paced environment. Experience with Congress.gov and a demonstrated interest/knowledge of our federal policy issues are a plus.
