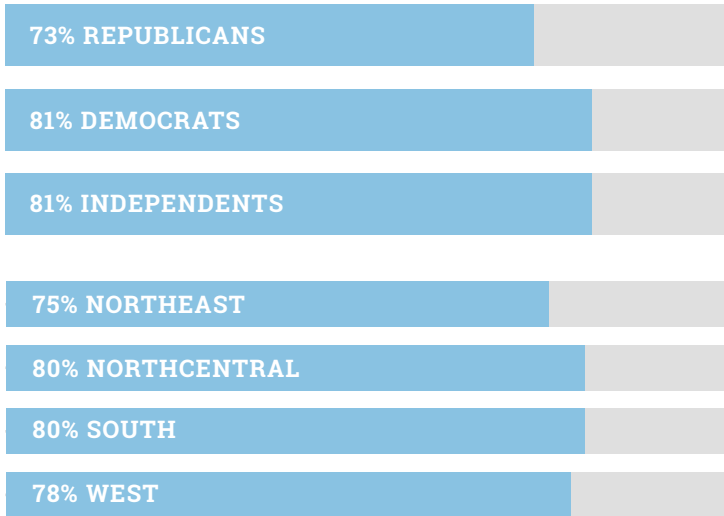

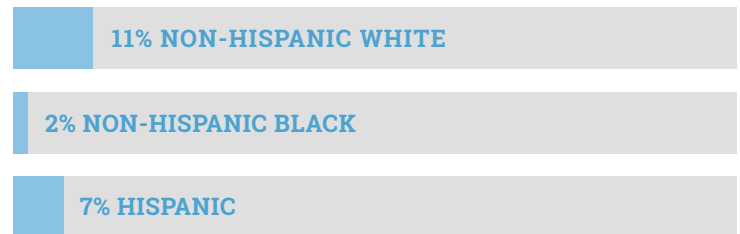
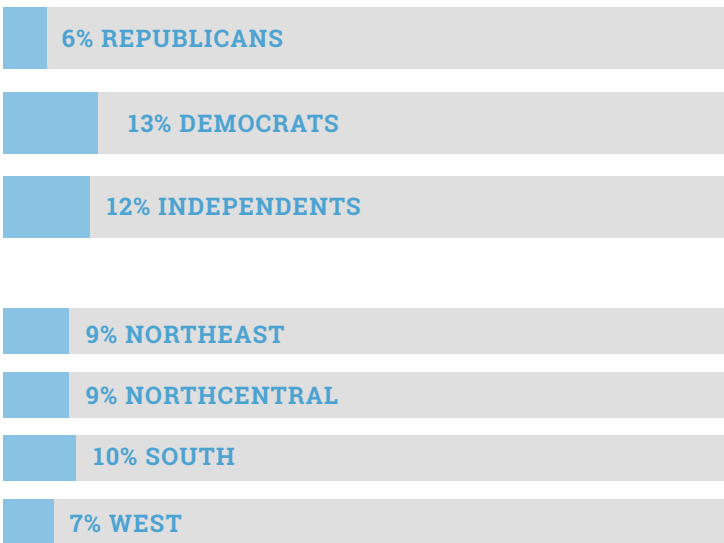

Question: Do you believe that teens should receive more information about abstinence or postponing sex, birth control and STI protection, or both?

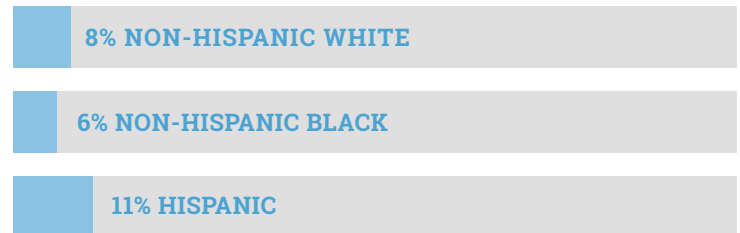
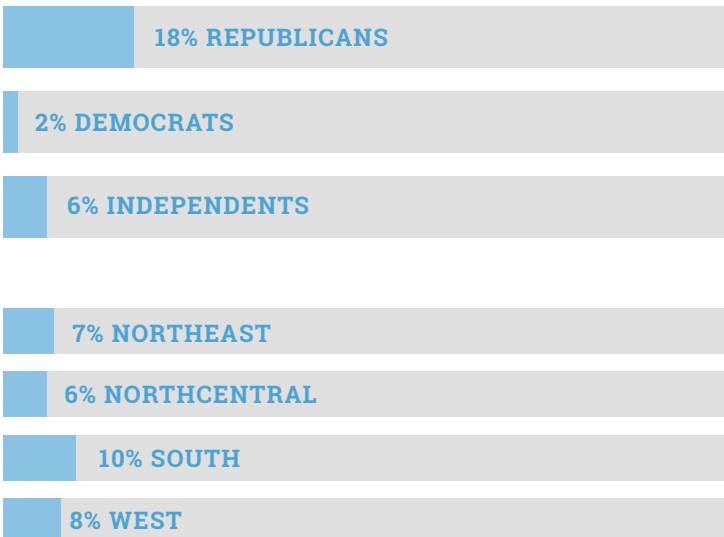
79% BOTH ABSTINENCE AND BIRTH CONTROL



10% BIRTH CONTROL AND STI PROTECTION

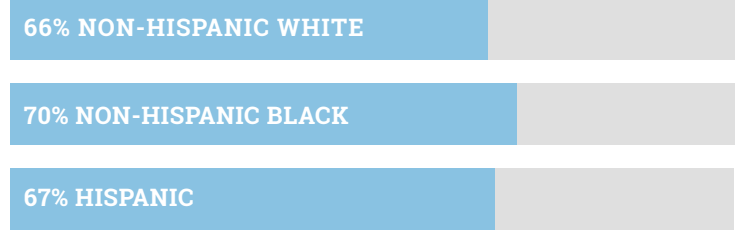
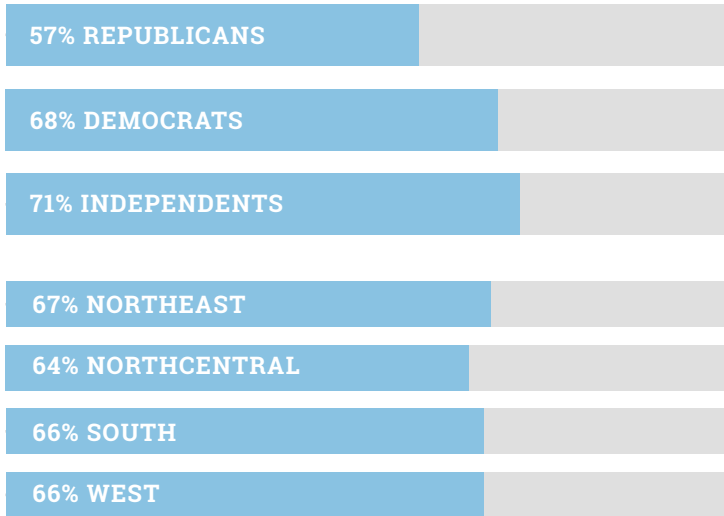


8% ABSTINENCE OR POSTPONING SEX

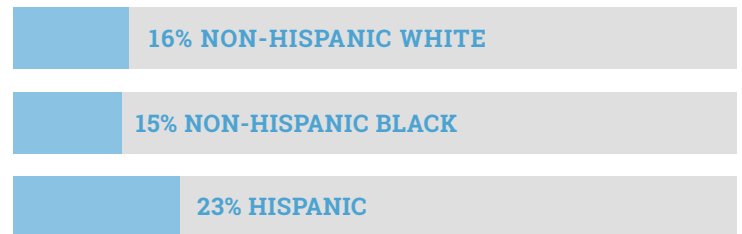
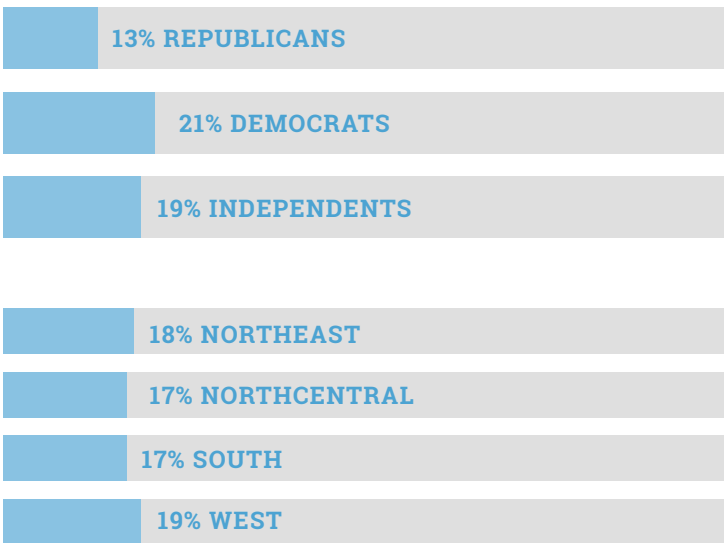

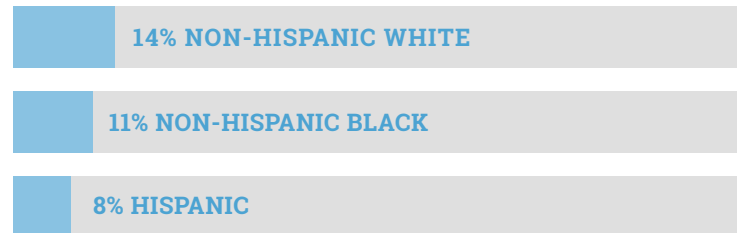
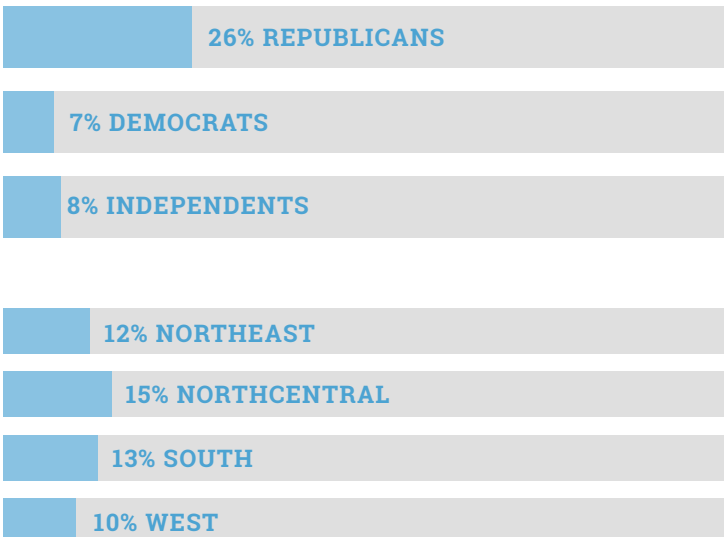
66% BOTH POSTPONING SEX AND BIRTH CONTROL/STI PROTECTION



18% ONLY BIRTH CONTROL/STI PROTECTION

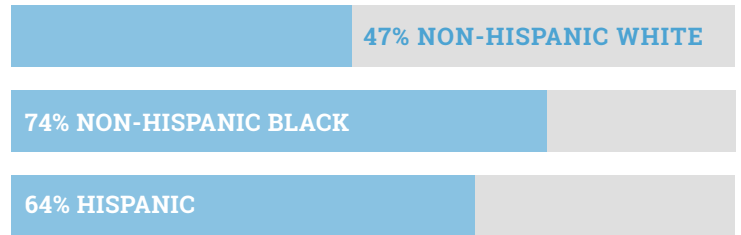
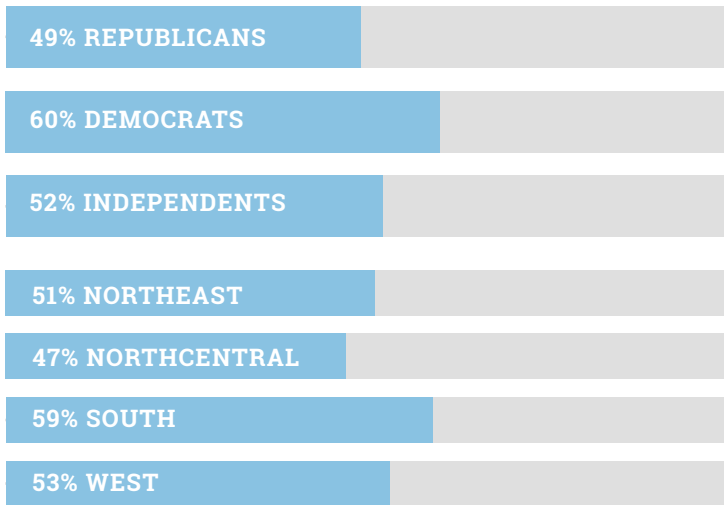

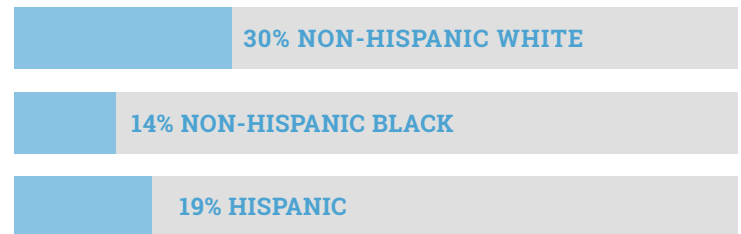
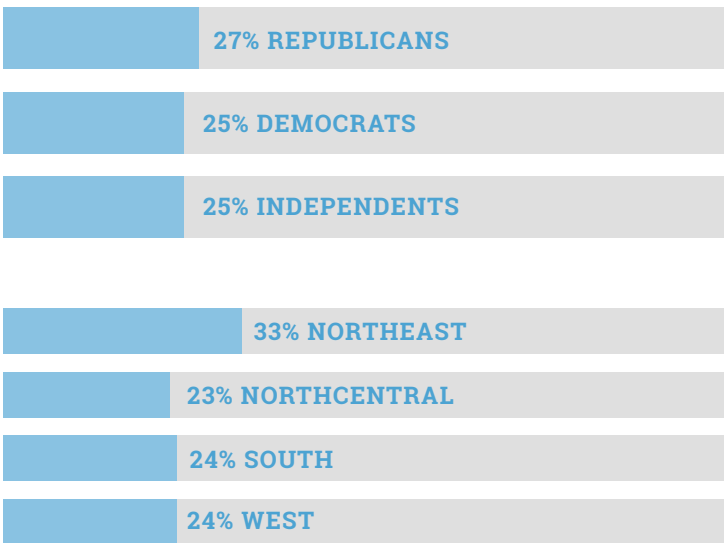


Question: How would you describe the current efforts to prevent teen pregnancy in your community?
Would you say they are more than adequate, adequate, or that more should be done?

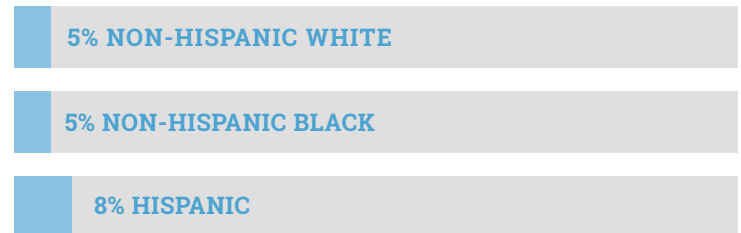
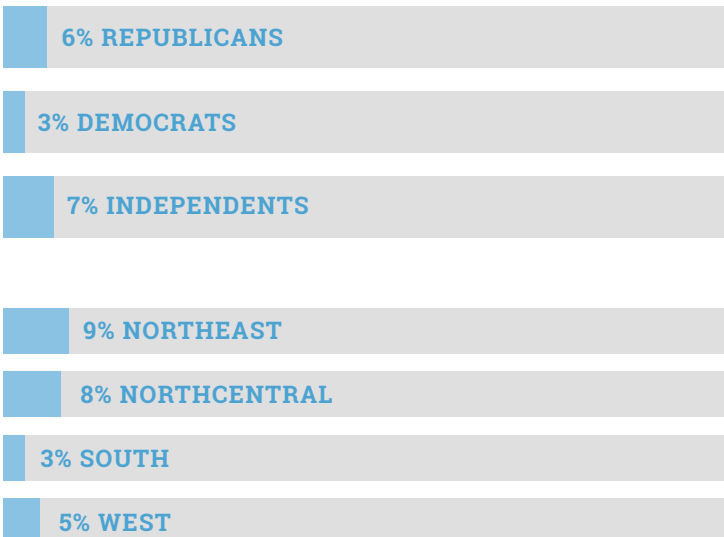
54% MORE SHOULD BE DONE
